COMPLAINT

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Stalking - Engages in Stalking

Minnesota Statute: 609.749.5(a)

Maximum Sentence: 10 years or \$20,000 or both

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 06/19/2026 to 09/19/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26030209

Charge Description: On or between June 19, 2026 and September 19, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Tosumbua Kehinde Collins Parker, did engage in stalking with respect to a single victim or one or more members of a single household which the actor knows or has reason to know would cause the victim under the circumstances to feel terrorized or to fear bodily harm and which does cause this reaction on the part of the victim, is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than ten years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$20,000, or both.

COUNT II

Charge: Domestic Assault-GM-Subsequent Violation

Minnesota Statute: 609.2242.2

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 09/19/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26030209

Charge Description: On or about September 19, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Tosumbua Kehinde Collins Parker did, against a family or household member, as defined in M.S.A. 518B.01 Subd. 2, commit an act with intent to cause fear in another of immediate bodily harm or death and has a previous qualified domestic violence-related offense conviction or an adjudication of delinquency within ten years.

COUNT III

Charge: Obstruct Legal Process-Interfere w/Peace Officer

Minnesota Statute: 609.50.1(2), with reference to: 609.50.2(2)

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 09/19/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26030209

Charge Description: On or about September 19, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Tosumbua Kehinde Collins Parker did, intentionally, obstruct, resist, or interfere with a peace officer while the officer was engaged in the performance of official duties and the act was accompanied by force or violence or the threat thereof.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

In the morning on September 19, 2026, Victim 1 called 911 and reported that Tosumbua Kehinde Collins Parker (DOB: 07/13/2000) was trying to break Victim 1's car window while Victim 1 was inside the vehicle.

Parker and Victim 1 reside together and have a child in common. Dispatch told police they could hear someone pounding on a window while they spoke with Victim 1.

Victim 1 told police Parker has been "laying hands" on Victim 1 since their child was born eight weeks ago.

Victim 1 captured a video recording of the incident in which Parker tried to break Victim 1's car window. Victim 1 said if Parker had gotten into Victim 1's car or Victim 1 had exited Victim 1's car, Parker would have assaulted Victim 1. Victim 1 said she knew she would get "hit" if Parker broke the car window.

Though Victim 1 lives with Parker, Victim 1 has been staying at hotels recently and living in her car because she is afraid of Parker.

On September 19, 2026, Victim 1 returned to the parties' residence in Blue Earth County to retrieve some personal property. After a brief conversation there with Parker, Victim 1 became uncomfortable, returned to her vehicle, and locked the door. Parker followed Victim 1 and hit the driver's side window with his elbow, which Victim 1 recorded on video. Officer Sokolov observed this reported conduct in the recording Victim 1 showed Sokolov.

Victim 1 reported Parker stated he was going to find something bigger and make sure he broke the car window. Subsequently he hit the window with a child's toy four to five times. Victim 1 was surprised the window did not break. Parker then circled the vehicle, trying to open other doors and break another window.

Victim 1 described Parker's history of violence towards Victim 1: "he is going to put his hands on me it's something I know already. If I don't give him an answer to a question. If I give him an answer he doesn't like. If I do something he doesn't like. If I try to leave . . . anything is a problem. He is going to hit me either way it goes." Victim 1 said Parker is "violent as hell."

Parker told Officer Sokolov that he and Victim 1 have been together for seven years. He denied hitting the car window. Later he acknowledged tapping on the window three times with his hand, which he demonstrated by tapping on the wall with his knuckles. "If I wanted to break that window, I would hit that bitch one time and break it," Parker said. Parker said he went to get a hanger to unlock the vehicle door and Victim 1 "acted like I had a fucking weapon."

Parker stated he was upset because he thought Victim 1 had been bringing other men around their child in common. Parker was especially upset about the possibility one of Parker's male friends had been spending time with Victim 1.

Parker said to Officer Sokolov, "you would have been upset about some shit like that. You would have spazzed out." Parker said, "I look crazy because I'm upset now."

After police placed Parker under arrest, he refused to walk to the squad car nearby and Officers had to shuffle him to the car. As they passed Victim 1's vehicle, Parker stopped walking and placed his feet into the ground, pushing against Officers. Parker said Officers would have to kill him or shoot him if he wasn't going to be allowed to talk to his child. As Officer Sokolov continued escorting Parker, Parker tried pulling

away. When they got near the rear door of the squad car, Parker placed his feet against the vehicle to prevent going into it. Once Parker was in the squad car, he placed his right foot in the corner of the door to prevent the door from being closed.

In Court File No. 07-CR-26-2494, Parker was charged with Threats of Violence and Domestic Assault for acts allegedly committed against Victim 1 on June 19, 2026.

Parker was convicted of Threats of Violence, a qualified domestic violence-related offense, on January 31, 2022, in Court File No. 07-CR-20-3859.

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
