**COMPLAINT**

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

**COUNT I**

**Charge: Traffic - DWI - Operate Motor Vehicle Under Influence of Alcohol**

Minnesota Statute: 169A.20.1(1), with reference to: 169A.25.2

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26017220

Charge Description: On or about June 3, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Raymundo Hernandez Martinez JR, did, drive, operate, or was in physical control of any motor vehicle when he/she was under the influence of alcohol, and two or more aggravating factors were present when the violation was committed.

**COUNT II**

**Charge: Traffic - DWI - Refuse to submit to chemical test; Breath or test refusal or failure**

Minnesota Statute: 169A.20.2(1), with reference to: 169A.25.2

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26017220

Charge Description: On or about June 3, 2026, in the County of THECOUNTY, Minnesota, Raymundo Hernandez Martinez JR, did, drive, operate, or was in physical control of any motor vehicle and the Defendant refused to submit to a chemical test of the person's breath upon the request of a peace officer who had probable cause to believe the person to be tested was under the influence and one or more aggravating factors were present when the violation was committed.

### COUNT III

**Charge: Obstruct Legal Process-Interfere w/Peace Officer**

Minnesota Statute: 609.50.1(2)

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26017220

Charge Description: On or about June 3, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Raymundo Hernandez Martinez JR did, intentionally, obstruct, resist, or interfere with a peace officer while the officer was engaged in the performance of official duties and the act was accompanied by force or violence or the threat thereof.

### COUNT IV

**Charge: Traffic-DL-Driving after cancellation-inimical to public safety**

Minnesota Statute: 171.24.5

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26017220

Charge Description: On or about June 3, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Raymundo Hernandez Martinez JR did after being given notice, or reasonably should have known of the cancellation, disobeyed the order by operating in this state any motor vehicle, the operation of which requires a driver's license, while her/his license or privilege was canceled; and the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety has determined that the operation of a motor vehicle on the highways by the person would be inimical to the public safety or welfare.

### COUNT V

**Charge: Traffic Regulation - Vehicle Lighting; Lights to Be Displayed Sunset-Sunrise**

Minnesota Statute: 169.48.1(a)(1)

Maximum Sentence: Fine of \$300 or less.

Offense Level: Petty Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 06/03/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26017220

Charge Description: On or about June 3, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Raymundo Hernandez Martinez JR did operate a motor vehicle within this State and did fail to display lighted headlamps, lighted tail lamps and illuminating devices as required between sunset and sunrise.

## STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On June 3, 2026, at approximately 9:45 P.M., Officer McCarville was on routine patrol within the Mankato City limits, within Blue Earth County. While on patrol Officer McCarville observed a Hyundai Palisade (MN license plate 04881180) driving with no lights on. Officer McCarville turned around, followed the vehicle and activated his squad camera to record the event. While behind the vehicle Officer McCarville observed vehicle pull into a parking spot moments before Officer McCarville activated his emergency lights. The vehicle stopped and Officer McCarville approached the vehicle.

Officer McCarville observed no other occupants in the vehicle. The driver was identified by his name and DOB as Raymundo Hernandez Martinez Jr. (02-21-1982). While speaking with Martinez Jr. Officer McCarville detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from inside the vehicle. Officer McCarville also observed Martinez Jr. to have glossy and bloodshot eyes. Martinez Jr. indicated he was coming from a "friends," and that he did not have a driver's license and believe his license was revoked. He first denied having any alcoholic beverages then agreed that he had had a couple alcoholic beverages. Officer McCarville also observed a package of Coors Light sitting behind the driver's seat.

Officer McCarville ran the license plate; however, the license plate came back not on file. Officer McCarville asked Martinez Jr. about the license plate. Martinez Jr. was able to provide proof of insurance and attempted to call his wife for information regarding the license plate. Officer McCarville then ran the vehicle by its VIN and was able to get a read back with the proper license plate being UAU522 on the vehicle.

Officer McCarville requested Martinez Jr. to step out of vehicle. Martinez asked the Officer to hold on and proceeded to stay in the vehicle while speaking to his wife on the phone. Martinez Jr was asked a second time to step out, which he finally did while continuing to talk to his wife on the phone. He was then asked to leave the phone in vehicle in which he replied that he did not have to. He then walked to the back of the Vehicle and put a cigarette in his mouth. Officer McCarville then asked if he was refusing Standard Field Sobriety Tests. Martinez ignored this question. Martinez Jr. then walked around the vehicle while still on the phone and was stopped by Officer Koss. Martinez Jr was asked if he would be willing to do the Standard Field Sobriety Tests one more time and he finally agreed.

Martinez Jr. then attempted to get back into his vehicle to grab a lighter. He was advised he was not allowed to go into his vehicle. Martinez Jr. then became more upset and raised his voice. Martinez Jr. then stated he did not want to participate in testing. At one point Martinez was advised that he was under arrest and Officer McCarville took hold of his right forearm. Officer McCarville then commanded him to put his hands behind his back in which he began to physically resist Officers by flexing his muscles and clenching his fists, preventing Officers from placing his hands behind his back. Martinez Jr. was advised several times that he was under arrest and to place his hands behind his back. Martinez Jr. continued to resist and not follow commands. Martinez told Officers that they were beginning to "piss him off," and began reaching around. Martinez was verbally aggressive and yelling at Officers throughout the arrest. Other Officers were required to help restrain and arrest Martinez Jr. Martinez Jr. was eventually placed into the squad and escorted to Blue Earth County Jail.

While at the Jail he was read the Breath Test Advisory. He stated that he understood what had been read to him and that he wished to consult with an Attorney. Martinez Jr. was then provided with a phone and multiple phone directories. Approximately 10 minutes later Martinez Jr. stated that he had called his wife and had not tried to call an attorney. Martinez's attorney time was ended and Officer McCarville asked Martinez Jr. if he would take a breath test and he stated he would not provide a breath sample. This was considered a refusal, and Martinez Jr. was escorted to his cell.

Martinez Jr. has two qualified prior impaired driving incidents within the last 10 years. August 25, 2016, Traffic -DWI- Refuse to Submit to Chemical Test, and March 5, 2026, IC Revocation.

## SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:  
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or  
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
