The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Emergency Telephone Calls/Communications - Interrupt, Interfere, Impede, Disrupt 911 Call

Minnesota Statute: 609.78.2(1)

Maximum Sentence: 364 days or \$3,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Gross Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 04/04/2026

Control #(ICR#): 26006838

Charge Description: On or about April 4, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Oliver Isaiah Samuel Mohwinkel did and intentionally interrupt, disrupt, impede, or interfere with an emergency call or intentionally prevent or hinder another from placing an emergency call.

COUNT II

Charge: Domestic Assault-Misdemeanor-Commits Act to Cause Fear of Immediate Bodily Harm or Death

Minnesota Statute: 609.2242.1(1)

Maximum Sentence: 90 days or \$1,000 fine, or both.

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 04/04/2026

Charge Description: On or about April 4, 2026, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Oliver Isaiah Samuel Mohwinkel, did, against a family or household member, as defined in M.S.A. 518B.01 Subd. 2, commit an act with intent to cause fear in another of immediate bodily harm or death.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Deputy Andrew Hagen states that on April 4, 2026, at approximately 8:31 a.m., he and other deputies were dispatched to a domestic assault call for service in rural Blue Earth County. The caller, Victim 1 reported to dispatch that Victim 1 needed help, Defendant locked Victim 1 in the house, and there were no injuries. Victim 1 identified Defendant as Oliver Mohwinkel. There were weapons in the basement but Victim 1 reported he will not touch them. Mohwinkel was downstairs. They had a fight this morning, and Victim 1 wanted it documented. It was physical. He has pushed Victim 1, held Victim 1, and ripped the phone away. He threw the phone and Victim 1 picked it up. Victim 1 told dispatch Victim 1 was going to out to the car, was packing some things in the house.

Deputy Hagen arrived on scene at 8:48 a.m. Deputy Hagen saw Mohwinkel walking north over the septic mound and then walk back south. Deputy Hagen stepped out and approached Oliver Mohwinkel, and told him he needed to sit in the squad car while he spoke with his Victim 1. Deputy Hagen performed a pat search for weapons and found none.

Deputy Hagen approached Victim 1 who was sitting sideways in the driver's seat of a Chevy Malibu. He noted two young children in car seats in the back. Victim 1 was crying, sobbing, and almost hyperventilating. Deputy Hagen asked Victim 1 to tell him what happened and Victim 1 said they had a fight over spilled water, as a humidifier was tipped over in their bedroom. Victim 1 asked him to pick it up and he kept walking around it for about five minutes. Victim 1 grabbed a towel and picked it up and they had a fight about it. The fight escalated. Victim 1 had a child in her arms, and he grabbed her arm and pushed her across the room. Deputy Hagen asked if she was injured, and she said no. She said it kept escalating. She said after a while when they were downstairs, he grabbed their son out of her arms, ran across the bed, and locked the door and held the door shut so she could not get out.

Victim 1 said he does not want her to take the kids. Whenever they fight, she takes the kids and goes to a different location. When asked about him taking the phone, Victim 1 said he threw her phone across so she could not reach it and call for help. When asked if she was trying to call 911, she said she would call a relative. Victim 1 said she did not want charges, but just wanted everything documented. When asked if she was scared today by this, she said he has never been physical like this before. They have not had a great relationship for a while now, but not to this point. She said he owns the house and is worried she will not be able to go back. When asked about the shove, she said she did not think he would hurt the kids and did not want to hurt her. She thought it was a moment of rage.

Deputy Hagen approached the squad car to speak with Mohwinkel. He removed the Miranda Warning card and read the warning to Mohwinkel. He stopped after each statement to verify he understood each statement. Mohwinkel agreed to waive his rights and speak to Deputy Hagen. He told Mohwinkel that she said their relationship was not good right now. He said it is not that. When asked what is going on, Mohwinkel said she would not tell Deputy Hagen, but after she had their second child, she will not get the mental treatment she needs. He said she does not like to talk about and it is what it is. He said today, he felt so bad about it. He said it all started about water being spilled on the floor. He said she flipped out about it.

He said for the longest time, he has kept his mouth shut, and let it play out because she just needs time to cool off, and do what she needs to do. Mohwinkel said today he snapped and he should not have.

Mohwinkel said he had one of the kids with him and said if she wanted to leave, she takes one and he keeps one, half and half. He said she was not listening to that. Mohwinkel said he did grab her arm and said that they cannot keep doing this. He said it was not violent or causing any pain. He said they cannot

constantly keep doing this back and forth.

Mohwinkel said he was holding one kid, and said he did hold the door and told her to think about what she is you are doing. He said by that time she had already called.

When told that she said he had thrown her phone, Mohwinkel said he did take her phone and toss it on the bed when she was trying to call law enforcement. He said they did not need to call. He said let's just think about this and talk about this. Deputy Hagen told him he knew she was going to call 911, and he said she threatens to call all the time. When asked about grabbing her hand, he denied pushing her and acknowledged they were both holding the children. Mohwinkel said he knew it was wrong and should not have done it.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
