The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Theft-By Swindle

Minnesota Statute: 609.52.2(a)(4), with reference to: 609.52.3(2)
Maximum Sentence: 10 years or \$20,000 fine, or both
Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 01/01/2025 to 08/31/2025

Control #(ICR#): 25023081

Charge Description: On or between January 1, 2025 and August 31, 2025, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, Samuel Robert Summers, did by swindling, whether by artifice, trick, device, or any other means, obtained property or services from another person and the value of the property or services stolen exceeds \$5,000.00.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

In the morning on August 14, 2025, Officer Ellis from the Mankato Department of Public Safety spoke with Victim 1, who owns Business 1 in Blue Earth County. Victim 1 reported two employees, Kari Louise Albrecht (DOB: 06/17/1981) and Samuel Robert Summers (DOB: 06/28/1979) had been intentionally misreporting time worked on their timecards, receiving payment for work they did not complete. Victim 1 stated that Albrecht and Summers typically work two or three days each week but had been reporting working 40 hours per week.

Victim 1 said Summers was only approved to work on Tuesday, Thursday, and one hour on Monday. Instead, Summers had been reporting working everyday. While employees were expected to punch in on a timecard machine when they arrived, Summers failed to punch in for several months and wrote that he worked five days a week for 20-25 hours total.

Similarly, Albrecht was only assigned to work Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, but reported she worked every weekday, 20-25 hours per week total, and handwrote her timecards instead of time-stamping them as requested.

Both Albrecht and Summers also called in sick and requested days off, asking other employees to cover their shifts for them, but they still reported on their timecards that they worked. Victim 1 said Victim 1 had text messages that showed Albrecht and Summers requested time off but still reported working on those days.

For example, Victim 1 said, Summers reported working several hours the previous week but did not work at all. After further investigation, Victim 1 learned that Albrecht and Summers had been falsifying their timecards for almost a year.

Witness 1 is employed by Business 1 and provided calendars to law enforcement showing Summers' (1) normal scheduled workdays; (2) scheduled days Summers asked to take off; and (3) days Summers claimed he work but did not. The calendars showed a total of 335.50 hours Summers claimed he worked but did not, totaling \$6,039.00.

Witness 1 provided a similar calendar for Albrecht that showed a total of 236 hours Albrecht claimed she worked but did not, totaling \$4,248.00.

Victim 1 fired Albrecht and Summers after discovering what they had been doing. According to Victim 1, Albrecht and Summers admitted intentionally misreporting their hours worked, admitting it was "not fair" for them to do that.

Officer McClinton called Albrecht and Summers. Summers said he would go to speak with McClinton but did not. Albrecht did not return McClinton's call.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
